# **Finding and Discussion**

According to a book by Betty Schrampfer Azar entitled *Understanding and Using English Grammar* (1989), it is briefly explained about twelve kinds of verb tenses in English. They are settled in four conditions: the simple tenses, the progressive tenses, the perfect tenses, and the perfect progressive tenses. Then each of them is divided into three parts. They belong to the present, past, and future. Those are the whole verb tenses in grammar that English learners need to learn. Yet, there will be only some examples of verb tenses that will be discussed in this paper.

The simple tenses is the first tenses that English beginner learners can learn. In Simple present tense, it uses the main verb/base form of the verb (infinitive without to). In general, the simple present expresses events or situations that exist always, usually, habitually; they exist now, have existed in the past, and probably will exist in the future (Azar, 1989:2).

Form: Subject + verb + rest of sentence.

The example can be seen in the lyric of song as follows:

According to the formula, the bold sentences above can be classified as a simple present tense form. The analysis is going to be this following:

Form: Subject + verb + rest of sentence.

**Example:** I know it breaks your heart

Explanation: <u>I</u>(as the subject of the sentence) <u>know</u>(as the main verb of the sentence)<u>it</u> **breaks your heart**(as the rest of the sentence).

The second verb tense is simple past. At one particular time in the past, this happened. It began and ended in the past (Azar, 1989:2).

Form:Subject + verb 2 + rest of sentence.

The example can be seen in the lyric of song as follows:

I let my soul fall into you

I never thought I'd fall right through

I fell for every word you said

You made me feel I needed you

And forced my heart to think it's true

But **I found** I'm powerless with you

Now I don't need your wings to fly

No. I don't need a hand to hold in mine this time

You held me down, but I broke free

I found the love inside of me

Now I don't need a hero to survive

Cause I already saved my life

Cause I already saved my life

# I fell into your fantasy

But that's all our love will ever be

**I lost hope** in saving you and me

You think I'm lost, falling apart

But your lies just made a stronger heart

My life is just about to start

According to the formula, the bold sentences above can be classified as a simple past tense form. The analysis is going to be this following:

Form: Subject + verb 2 + rest of sentence.

**Example:** I found the love inside of me

Analysis:  $\underline{\mathbf{I}}$  (as the subject of the sentence)  $\underline{\mathbf{found}}$  (as the verb 2 of the sentence)  $\underline{\mathbf{the\ love}}$ 

**inside of me**(as the rest of the sentence).

The other verb tense is simple future tense. It explains about one particular time in the future this will happen (Azar, 1989:2).

Form: Subject + will + verb + rest of sentence.

The example can be seen in the lyric of song as the following:

I knew I loved you then

But you'd never know

'Cause I played it cool when I was scared of letting go

I knew I needed you

But I never showed

But I wanna stay with you

Until we're grey and old Just say you won't let go Just say you won't let go

I wake you up with some breakfast in bed
I'll bring you coffee
With a kiss on your head
And I'll take the kids to school
Wave them goodbye
And I'll thank my lucky stars for that night

When you looked over your shoulder For a minute, I forget that I'm older I wanna dance with you right now, oh And you look as beautiful as ever And I swear that every day you'll get better You make me feel this way somehow (Say you wont let go by James Arthur, 2016)

According to the formula, the bold sentences above can be classified as a simple future tense form. The analysis is going to be this following:

Form: Subject + will + verb + rest of sentence. Example: I'll thank my lucky stars for that night

**Explanation:** <u>I</u>(as the subject of the sentence) <u>'II</u>(as statement will/indicate future) <u>thank</u> (as the verb of the sentence) <u>my lucky stars for that night</u> (as the rest of the sentence).

#### Conclusion

Verb tense is one of chapters in grammar that is most influencial in constructing sentences.

It is important to apply it using English. Those analysis using formulas of English grammar and the sentences from lyric of songs are only some examples of how lyric of songs can be easy method to learn English grammar. By analyzing that many lyric of songs are constructed based on true formulas of verb tenses, English beginner learners can get easier to memorize verb tenses. Learner can enjoy every single music or song while learning the other positive side that is formula of verb tenses.

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
